WHEN IT WAS BOUGHT BY
TRIS MALONE, JR.

MR. AND MRS. J. EDGAR WOODRUM
ACQUIRED THE HOUSE IN 1961 AND
LIVED HERE MORE THAN FORTY YEARS.
THEIR FOUNDATION SOLD THE RESIDENCE IN 1996,
AT WHICH TIME IT WAS PURCHASED BY
THE MICHAEL W. CHRISTOPHER FAMILY
AND RENOVATED WITH ARCHITECTS
PETER TRAPFOLDI AND DAVID LEE JAINES.

AND ANNEXED TO NEW ORLEANS IN 1878.
